

Finding our Faith Stories

A Small Group Experiment for Lent

I don't believe we Presbyterians are really God's 'frozen chosen.' Maybe we are a little shy when it comes to speaking about our personal faith. And that is ok. And yet, as Michael Curry says, as God's shy people we need to learn to share our stories in ways that are both meaningful and authentic.

This is where our Small Group Experiment for Lent "Finding our Faith Stories" comes in. With the dual goal of helping people in our church family identify and articulate their own faith stories and grow closer to one another in Christ, we invite you to join a faith story sharing group for Lent of 2018.

What does a faith story sharing group look like? For the course of Lent, we meet in groups of ideally 8 people and share with each other our faith stories, around

questions like: Why do I go to church? Why am I a Christian? What are some of my doubts? (How) Has Christian community changed my life?




Living Biblically Premiers on February 26, 8:30 Central on CBS

Dear Eastridge Church Family,

Greetings! Though I have not seen you since June, I thank you for your presence in my life through your prayers and support. It is my joy to update you on how the third year of my seminary journey is progressing. God has richly blessed this season. The biggest joy to share with you is that I am engaged! My fiancée, Hope Edwards, is both a fellow Lincoln-ite and Gordon-Conwell seminarian. In high school, our paths crossed as acquaintances when we served as youth advisors to LPS for two years. After we graduated from our respective colleges, our paths reconnected here at the

seminary. We are confident that our Lord is leading us into full-time gospel ministry together! We will marry June 2, 2018, at our church in Boston near the seminary.

Turning to academics, I am a year and a half away from graduating with my Master of Divinity (MDiv) and Master of Theology (ThM) in Preaching in Spring 2019. I have decided to add the ThM as a final year because I perceive my calling is to a preaching ministry. The MDiv is a generalist degree, with only two preaching courses, so the ThM will enable me to truly master the preaching discipline. Over this past semester, I had five classes (an above-average load). Two classes of note focused on the practical aspect of ministry: Pastoral Ministry and Transforming Leadership in the Local Church. These two classes were taught by a PCUSA professor with 30+ years of pastoral ministry experience. Between these two classes, I studied church life-cycles and paradigms, theology of worship and creating orders of worship, pastoral care and counseling, leadership and conflict-resolution, case studies of church crises, and more. These will be lessons I draw upon for decades of ministry to come.

In terms of ministry activity, Hope and I have been involved with our local church. We taught 3rd-5th grade Sunday School, are being mentored by couples in our church, and are part of a team to help craft a vision for discipleship within the church. Over this past Christmas break, I preached at my home church, Desert Palms, in AZ. The scripture was James 1:22-25 and I entitled the sermon, 'Just Do It.' God's message was that we are to hear and do the Word. A few days after preaching a friend from church thanked me for the sermon. He shared with me that as a result of hearing the sermon he had decided to join the pastor's Bible study that Monday. I cannot imagine any better result from this sermon! Praise God for how He works through preaching.

Finally, as Hope and I prepare for Gospel ministry together, we have made a ministry website: www.HopeVenturesForTheGospel.com. Here, you can read about our call to church ministry and seminary training toward that end. On our website you will find a way to

sign up to receive our 'HOPEful updates.' These are monthly email newsletters we will send out with prayer requests, tidbits of what we are learning in classes, stories from ministry, and updates concerning ordination and our future (this will replace my Facebook blog). Our website also lists a couple ways to financially partner with us and provides status updates of our goals. Again, thank you for your support over the years! I could not do seminary without your prayerful and financial support. To God be the glory!

For some ideas of where to go that I've spotted -Dollar Tree sells Large jugs of detergent and full-size dish soaps for \$1. Big Lots sells canisters of Salt for \$0.50 and has good deals on canned food. Dollar Tree often has bet-

ter deals than the grocery store on many items that our Pantry uses.

ways) cancel its events for the day, including office hours.


