



From the Pastor's Pen...

Happy New Year! And, no, I'm not a month early! This Sunday, December 2, is actually the start of the new year! As you may know, advent marks the beginning of the new liturgical, or church, year. With Christians all around the world, we enter a time of expectation,

longing, and preparation. It's a new year, a new time, a new journey. We all know the story... a young maiden is chosen by God to bear the Messiah. There are angels, and shepherds, and a fiancé. There's even a donkey!

One of the latest film versions of the story (The Star) also has a dove, a mouse, some dogs,

and some pretty witty camels. At the end of this version, Deborah, the camel remarks, "You know, I think people are gonna remember this night. What happened here, around this manger, will be celebrated for thousands of years. Families will come together and exchange presents and sing carols. All to remember the grace of this moment that we are witnessing right now."

Once again, as we enter this Ad-

vent season, we will hear, participate, and study this well known story. We will turn to the well known verses of Luke's Gospel, with Caesar Augustus, Quirinius, Elizabeth and Zechariah, and swaddling clothes. Taken by itself, this story is unusual for a couple of reasons. First, Joseph does not appear on the scene un-

I've never actually really thought about Luke's account that way before. It was recently pointed out for me in a wonderful devotional by Carol Howard Merritt called, "I am Mary." But of course, the exploration of Mary's story is nothing new. From Justin Martyr (c. 160 AD) to Catherine of Siena (c. 1350 AD) to Meister Eck-

> hart (c. 1275), theologians and philosophers have pondered the role and story of Mary. Mary is even given a Greek title, "Theotokos," which means "Godbearer."

> As we explore the Lukan text this Advent, I believe we will find a young girl who works through her fear and confusion, takes risks,

finds joy, and becomes a vital part of the story of the Incarnation. It is my hope and my prayer that we, too, might do the same.




Time to think about Per Capita! This year it is \$40 per member. When each Eastridge member pays



BETHLEHEM PEACE LIGHT 2018

There is a cave under the Church of

the Nativity in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. Oil lamps have been continuously lit there for over a thousand years.

Every year in Advent a child from Austria is chosen to fetch the Peace Light from one of these lamps. The light is carried in two blast proof miners lamps on an Austrian Airlines jet from Tel Aviv, Israel to Vienna, Austria from where it is distributed to delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries.

Ever since 9/11, the light has also been brought to New York. Scouts and church organizations and other volunteers meet the Peace Light at JFK airport, and light their lamps from the miners lamps, spreading the Peace Light across North America.

The Peace Light will be coming to Lincoln on Wednesday, December 12th.



days during office hours.

The best way to carry the Peace Light flame is with a lantern fueled with smokeless paraffin oil. Candles can work, but sometimes snuff themselves out when the motion of the vehicle causes the wax to splash on the wick. Care should be taken when transporting a flame inside a car. The lantern or candle should be in a bucket either with some sand or kitty litter

> in the bottom or some other way to add stability.

Once you get the Peace Light home, please share it with your friends and neighbors. If you want to keep the Peace Light, we recommend blowing out the pilot light on an old style water heater, stove or fire place, then relighting it with the Peace Light flame. If you are not sure how to relight your pilot light, please consult a professional before you blow it out.
