### What does it mean to have a compassionate faith?

Trevor Hudson is a white pastor in South Africa, which has been his context for ministry for more than 35 years. He began his ministry during apartheid, and continues to work toward a post-apartheid South Africa. Along the way, he started leading "compassion pilgrimages" instead of mission trips, and defines the difference this way: "we would come as pilgrims, not as tourists; as learners, not as teachers; as receivers, not as givers; as listeners, not as talkers."<sup>1</sup>



#### Who is GiFT for?

Literally for everyone. Meaning: for youth, singles, couples, moms and dads, college students, teenagers, kids, grandmas and grandpas, empty nesters, newcomers, working people, retired people, people with pets, and for those without. In short: for everyone (did we say that already?).

#### What are the goals of GiFT?

GiFT reclaims God's intent for faith to be shared in community and across generations. Through an experience of learning together, sharing faith, praying together, serving and celebrating rituals and traditions, GiFT helps connect families and individuals who want to spend more quality time together. GiFT builds relationships between the generations and across the congregation. By sharing our faith stories and learning from each other, we **Grow in Faith Together**.

#### What does a GiFT event look like?

GiFT takes place on the first Wednesday each month. A GiFT event begins at 5:30 pm with a joint dinner and a time of fellowship in the fellowship hall. At the heart of a GiFT evening is a fun interactive experience that centers around milestones of our lives, and engages all ages. GiFT also offers practical tools to nurture the faith of families and individuals in our daily lives.



#### "When did we see you hungry?"

Bread for the World is lobbying Congress to provide \$50 million to help low-income families purchase food during the summer months for children who are certified to receive free or reduced-price school meals during the school year. Our representative Jeff Fortenberry is the ranking Republican on the House subcommittee that sets funding levels for agriculture programs. His support could be crucial for developing bipartisan support for this legislation.

On March 15 between services the Outreach Committee will have a table set in the Welcome Center with all the materials you need to write to Rep. Fortenberry. You can write your letter there or compose your letter at home. On the following Sunday your letters will be blessed as a part of the morning offering.

Update: Last year many of you wrote to our representatives in Congress supporting the Global Nutrition Resolution. It has passed the Senate, and awaits final action by the House. Representative Fortenberry is one of 153 co-sponsors.

#### Worship Volunteers Needed: Liturgists





through music according to the Gospel of Matthew. We invite you to bring a friend, a family member, a coworker or anyone who can benefit from hear the Good News of Christ.






Since a snowstorm cut into our original Lifetouch phoand portraits tography sessions, Life-

#### The Examen Prayer

During the season of Lent and anytime during the year, a daily prayer of reflection that I have used is called The Examen. Its roots are found in Ignatian Spirituality that are part of the Jesuit community and tradition. Yet, as followers of Jesus Christ, anyone can

use this simple prayer for review and reflection.

So, what is the Examen? It is a prayer that reviews the day with a thought of what has been a confession – a desolation, as it is called. Simply offered, one can review their day of the things that did not go well. It is allowing God's grace to cleanse and refresh one of those desolations – confessions.

#### For example,

Lord God, hear my prayer of confession – of the desolation that has limited me and my life this day. I name them to you in the faith that your cleansing grace in Jesus Christ will forgive and refresh me(......) Forgive and cleanse me by Your gracious merciful Spirit. The Examen is also a review of the blessings of the day – a consolation. One ends their prayer time with a positive assurance and peace of the blessings that have graced one's day with joy, happiness and love.

#### For example,

Lord, I thank you for the blessings – the consolations

that have inspired, comforted, and affirmed me as Your Child through Jesus Christ. I praise you for these blessings (......) and so much more in the name of Jesus Christ and by the power of Your blessed Holy Spirit. Amen

I would encourage anyone to find time at the end of their day to let this simple prayer of reflection be a guide. One may write their reflections in a journal. It is a personal statement of ultimate trust in

the One Who graces us with His embrace of love, our Lord Jesus Christ.
