

Community Strong! Join us this October for our after worship fireside chat LIVE on Sunday mornings! Our special guests will be: Derek and Teri Effle of Faith Partners Lincoln; and Lee Hinson-Hasty, Theological Education Funds Development at Presbyterian Foundation.

The Food Bank of Lincoln is seeking volunteers to assist with various functions, including bag packing at the Food Bank as well as at drive-thru mobile food distributions.

Our guest speaker on Sunday October 11, Michaella Kumke, indicated that the Food Bank would prefer that we sign up in groups rather than as individuals. To that end, Kris Brenneis and Susan Budler are hoping to put together a group of volunteers, from EPC or elsewhere if needed, to volunteer at Food Bank distribution sites (there are various sites around Lancaster County) on a recurring basis. Most likely we would indicate a monthly obligation, but could increase or decrease frequency depending on the size of the group, and the group's preference and availability. There are many different time frames for volunteer distributions, including evening hours. Requirements for all Volunteers

- Must wear a mask and gloves. Volunteers are asked to provide your own mask. The Food Bank will provide gloves (and masks if you are unable to provide your own).
- Must not be in a group considered high risk
- Must feel well and healthy and be symptom-free for at least 48 hours before volunteering
- Must be 18-59 years of age, or 16/17 with an adult or approved adult chaperone
- Must be able to safely lift up to 50 pounds
- Must be able to provide own transportation to/from assigned volunteer site(s)
- Must be willing and able to take direction
- Must value and demonstrate compassion to all guests, staff and other volunteers"
