Philippi is Paul's first destination outside Asia Minor, his first city to visit in Europe, and his first mission in a place where there was no Jewish community from which to begin preaching.


In Paul's letter to the Philippians, we get a unique glimpse of our beginnings as Christians.

history. The program will feature sacred readings, prayers, and music from a variety of Lincoln's faith and religious communities.

We will also feature a conversation between keynote speakers Parker J. Palmer and Rev. Dr. Gregory C. Ellison II on the influence of Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman, who was a spiritual mentor to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the first civil rights leader to meet with Mahatma Gandhi.

Palmer is a world-renowned Quaker author, educator, and founder of the Center for Courage and Renewal. He has been named one of most influential senior leaders in higher education. In 2010, he received the William Rainey Harper Award, whose previous recipients include Margaret Mead, Elie Wiesel, and Paolo Freire.

Ellison is an ordained Baptist minister, Associate Professor at Emory University's Candler School of Theology, artist, activist, and founder of Fearless Dialogues, a grassroots initiative that creates spaces for unlikely partners to engage in hard, heartfelt conversations. He is the author of "Cut Dead But Still Alive: Caring for African American Young Men" and edited a recent book on the influence of Thurman titled "Anchored in the Current: Discovering Howard Thurman as Educator, Activist, Guide, and Prophet." Palmer contributed an essay for this book.

I'm deeply grateful to the organizers of this special event, the Mayor's Interfaith Prayer Breakfast Committee, and to the sponsors which include the Lincoln Community Foundation, Community Health Endowment, Greater Lincoln Chamber Foundation, and the Faith Coalition of Lancaster County, among many others.

The Reopening Committee reported that everything went well for the first worship in the Sanctuary on March 14, 2021.

The Session affirmed its email vote to send letters to adult children of the congregation.

The Session approved a revision of the Personnel Manual concerning the

calculation of vacation time for all staff who work more than three-quarters' time.

Rev. Thomas Dummermuth reported that only 42 chapters remain to be transcribed for the Coronavirus Bible.

Carolyn Olsen and Robin Hadfield reported on the February 20, 2021, Homestead Presbytery meeting. Presbytery has not had a review of its finances since 2016. The Synod will now handle the presbytery's finances since the retirement of Cheryl Rennick. Presbytery will elect a volunteer treasurer.

Meals on Wheels: For many years the Eastridge Presbyterian Women (EPW) have coordinated participation in the delivery of Meals on Wheels on behalf of Eastridge Presbyterian Church. Most recently, Nan Nelson has served as the coordinator and contact person with Tabitha. At this point in time, the EPW is asking that Meals on Wheels become a ministry of the whole congregation, so coordination of Meals on Wheels for EPC will shift from EPW to the Hunger Action Board, with Jo Bateman being the contact person. Other than that, our church' participation remains the same, with EPC volunteers delivering meals every Monday.

We are currently in need of new volunteers to deliver our church's route on the 4th Monday of each month. The time commitment is from a Tabitha arrival time about 10:30 a.m.-10:45 and generally takes no more than 2 hours. It could be more or less, depending on the number of stops on the route, which varies as the clients needs change. Some volunteers are able to arrange to do this during their lunchtime. If you are interested in being a volunteer, or want more information please contact the church office. It is also helpful to have the names of those available to sub.

EASTRIDGE HOSPICE SINGERS UPDATE

The music ministry of our Eastridge Hospice Singers continues to provide the peace and comfort of music to those in hospice care through our virtual singing visits. In the spring of 2020, we had no idea how we would be able to still visit our friends in hospice. But God provided a way through staff members at residential facilities and hospice care homes who

were willing to connect us virtually to our friends. Most of our visits took place using Skype, FaceTime and Duo. And a few friends we connected with through phone calls when internet access wasn't available.

Recently I was asked to provide a virtual program for a

local community group about our ministry. As I prepared for this program I became curious as to how many people we had sung for since our ministry began and the number of visits we had provided. From December 2018 to March 2020, our 30 trained hospice singers provided 111 weekly and monthly "in person" visits to 65 individuals. Since April 2020, during the pandemic, Dori Bush, Karen Shelton and

myself have been blessed to provide 226 weekly virtual visits to 15 individuals along with 102 weekly phone calls to those without internet access. In total, from Dec 2018 through March 2021, God has blessed our ministry with the ability to provide 584 singing visits. Isn't that truly AMAZING? This certainly has proven to me, once again, that with God there is always a way!

We will continue to provide virtual visits for those requesting them and are looking forward to when we can again visit our friends in hospice with an "up close and personal" visit. 


Eastridge Presbyterian Women, EPC church staff and congregational family members: Greetings to all.
