
# 2021 Budget \$ 552,800

We should be at \$ 297,661 to make budget for 2021.







In July 1849, Harriet Tubman escaped slavery and went on to establish the Underground Railroad to help other slaves find freedom. Known as "Moses" and "The Black Ghost," Tubman used her knowledge of herbs, astronomy, and human nature to improve the lives of over 3,000 slaves. Despite having experienced brain damage as a teenager, she created a complex system of signals and signs to indicate safe passageways for fugitive slaves. During the Civil War, Tubman served as a Union spy and as a nurse, taught soldiers to use natural herbs to treat cholera, yellow fever, and chicken pox. She received a military pension and honor before she died at age 91 in a charity home she founded.
