The weekly Lamp



During the last eighteen months, many American corporations have issued public statements emphasizing their organizational goal to address racial injustices. Hiring and promoting employees of color is a way to demonstrate their commitment; despite public statements, the actual number of corporate leaders of color have declined since 2019. Currently, there are only four Black CEOs-three men and one woman. Why is it so difficult for people of color to rise to the highest levels of leadership in large corporations? Speculation about factors contributing to this small number are explored from

several perspectives:

"Why So Many Black Business Professionals are Missing from the C-Suite." (CBS News, December 10, 2019) Black people account for about 12% of the U.S. population, but occupy only 3.2% of the senior leadership roles at large companies in the U.S. and just 0.8% of all Fortune 500 CEO positions.
