ing food insecurity during this inflationary period. **We welcome continuing donations.** We distributed boxes to 54 households and served 25 (households) in-person shoppers on Wednesday, July 27 (266 people total!)

Building congregational vitality...Dismantling structural racism... Eradicating systemic poverty

The Presbyterian tradition of advocating for public schools, open to all children, dates to the origins of the reformed church in Switzerland and Scotland. That paradigm was carried to the colonies as America was settled. Public schools ensure that education is universally available to children, even those with financial difficulties and in parts of the country where few educational opportunities exist.

RealClear Opinion Research poll showed that American voters

want schools to teach students to be good citizens and think critically aside from reading and writing. Furthermore, a Gallup survey indicated that, for the first time since 2004, Americans are satisfied with the quality of K -12 education. With the accessibility of public schools, it is not surprising that enrollment at these schools has remained high over the years. In 2019 alone, public schools educated 50.8 million (90%) children. Why then are groups across the nation and even in Nebraska conducting attack campaigns against public schools? Is this movement focused on the quality of education provided in public schools or are there other motivating factors?

"Government Schools' or Public Schools? Trump, DeVos, and the Language of School

Choice" (EdWeek, By Evie Blad, February 5, 2020) "Government Schools" is a phrase most notably used by former U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos and groups that advocate for alternatives to traditional public schools. To public school organizations and educators, the use of the term seemed intentionally provocative, especially considering conservatives' distrust of government and desire to reduce its reach.
