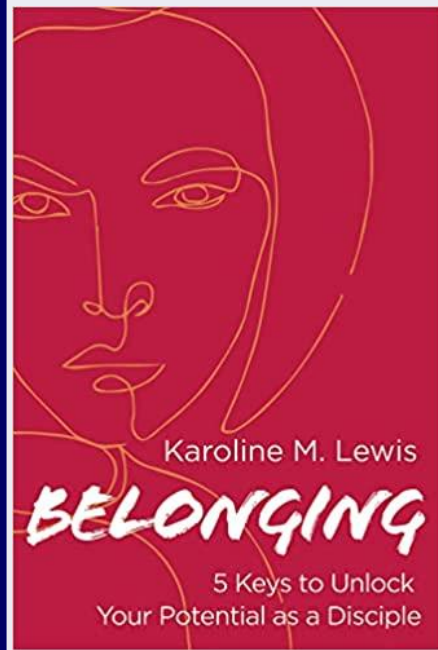
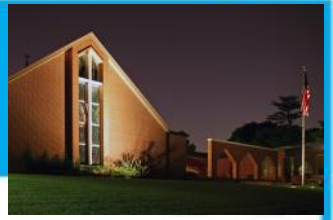

FROM THE EASTRIDGE OUTREACH COMMITTEE: The federal Farm Bill is a package of legislation passed roughly once every five years that has a tremendous impact on farming livelihoods, how food is grown, what kinds of foods are grown, and who will consume that food. The estimated cost is expected to exceed \$1,000,000,000,000 (yes, trillion with a T!), and 80% of spending is focused on nutrition programs (e.g., SNAP).

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS: MAY 25, 2023

The Session approved the minutes of the Session meeting of April 27, 2023.

The Session acknowledged that communion was served at the 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services on May 7, 2023.

The Session acknowledged that the Rev. Dummermuth officiated at the graveside service of Karen Paulsen on April 16, 2023, at Lincoln Memorial Funeral Park, and at the memorial service of Doug Fowler on May 19, 2023, at Roper and Sons South Chapel.

The Session acknowledged that the Rev. Dr. Melodie Jones Pointon officiated at the memorial service of the Rev. Dr. Timothy McClain on May 22, 2023, at Eastridge, hosted on behalf of Homestead Presbytery.

The Session approved a motion to allow the Eastridge Neighborhood Association to host a “Sip and Swap” event in the church parking lot in the fall.

The Session will have a special called meeting to discuss the LeaderWise report on Tuesday, June 13, 2023, at 6 p.m.

The Session approved hosting a large metal letter created by

Blake Allen, a student at Lincoln East and The Career Academy. The letters are intended to spread awareness about mental health issues.

Steve Anderson, Treasurer, reported that an opportunity will be provided for members of the congregation to learn about church finances after the worship service on June 4, 2023.

Bill Wehrbein provided a report on the Homestead Presbytery meeting. Presbytery is entering the implementation of the visioning process with its strategic plan. Teams are replacing committees which will require fewer people to serve. Staff will include the Stated Clerk, an administrative assistant, a volunteer treasurer, and a part-time facilitating presbyter.

Presbytery heard the first reading of an agreement to pass ownership of Calvin Crest Camp and Conference Center to the Calvin Crest Board. Presbytery will continue to provide financial support.

Presbytery voted on the proposed amendments to the Book of Order. Most were approved in the consent agenda. Others approved after discussion addressed the use of “honorably retired;” providing 12 weeks of parental leave in pastoral calls; and new church discipline procedures.
