#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN...

In addition to all the usual advent celebrations and preparations of music, decorations, festive gatherings, Bible studies, we also celebrated the baptisms of two babies. It's easy to love baptisms, a wonderful celebration of the community where the baptized is welcomed into the Body of Christ. In our Reformed tradition, it is a "sign and seal" - an outward sign of an inward grace. Or, it's something we can see and feel that celebrates something God does that we feel but cannot see. What a joy it is, as well, for our community to see the newly baptized, often officially presented for the first time. Of course, part of our tradition includes

not only acknowledging and receiving the promises of God, but also making promises - for the parents to raise the child in the Christian faith, and for the congregation to share the love of God with the child as they grow.

Oh, how quickly they will grow!

As we enter this new year, we will spend some time in the texts that mark Jesus' growth from newborn in a borrowed stable, through his presentation at the temple, to his baptism, to his conversations in the temple. Jesus will grow up quickly as we explore these stories together. The new year's celebrations will fade as we turn the calendar to February for an early Lenten season.

Here, at Eastridge Presbyterian Church, we will also experience ritual celebrations and growth that keep us turning again and again to those baptismal promises. Some of those things have become part of the fabric of who we are - in our Tuesday Afterschool Program, Youth Group, Bible studies, and ordination and installation of officers. Some of those things will mark an

acknowledgement of who we are today - as the task force on belonging continues its work; and as we look to change the bi-laws for our governing boards - but they do not change whose we are. Rather, I believe they mark the spiritual growth of our faith community as we again embrace and explore what it means to be "Christ-Centered. Community Strong."

It was 1983 when the two largest Presbyterian denominations in the United States sought reunification. The split originally occurred over issues of theology and social justice in the mid-1800s, and it was time for the Body of Christ to re-center, together. In true Presbyterian fashion, a committee was formed to create a

new confession of faith for the occasion. It was to be powerful and strong in its language, focusing on those things that bind us together as a new reunited denomination. The result was a confession called, "A Brief Statement of Faith, 1983" and has a strong opening statement, "In life

and in death we belong to God. Through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, we trust in the one triune God, the Holy One of Israel, whom alone we worship and serve."

Friends, as we embark on this new year of 2024, may you return again and again to the promises made and received in baptism as you continue to grow in faith. Our prayer as a community of faith is that this place can be a welcoming place for your questions, your fears, your doubts, and your explorations of who and whose you are - God's own beloved.

### AMENDMENTS TO CONGREGATION AND CORPORATION BYLAWS TO BE VOTED ON AT CONGREGATIONAL MEETING ON JANUARY 28, 2024

Earlier this year, we celebrated the 70th anniversary of Eastridge and began to look to the future. The Session established three task forces, including one to consider restructuring the boards of the church. We currently have 54 leadership spots on our four boards, and an average worship attendance of 95 in person and 22 screens online. We estimate that roughly 130 people worship with our community every week, meaning that 1/2 of our weekly attendance is needed to fill our boards. We wondered what we might be able to do as a community if our board structure looked different and required fewer elected leaders.

The Task Force developed, and the Session approved a proposal to restructure the church boards, which requires amendments to the congregation and corporation bylaws. The proposal was presented at the congregational meeting in November and will be voted on at the congregational meeting on January 28. Opportunities to ask questions or to learn more will be available at listening sessions on January 7 and January 21 following worship.

The task force recognized that the work of the church family remains the same, and it is the hope of the Task Force that by a revised structure of leadership will create avenues for members of all ages and walks of life to engage in tasks that fit their strengths and spiritual gifts.

In reviewing the work of the church boards and committees, we learned that there is overlap in the work of the Session and the Board of Deacons. This sometimes results in conflicts in scheduling or planned activities. To address this, the Task Force is recommending the consolidation of the Board of Deacons into the committees of the session. It will no longer be a separate board. Two new Session committees will be responsible for the activities currently overseen by the Deacons. These committees are Congregational Engagement and Congregational Care. The structure will make it possible for Individuals to volunteer for specific projects or activities without committing to serve a three-year term on the Board of Deacons.

The Memorial and Endowment Committee will become a function of the Board of

Trustees. Its members will no longer be elected by the congregation but will be recruited by the Board of Trustees. At least three people will serve, and their primary role will be to monitor the investments of the church, including their gifts and disbursements.

Other recommended changes include reducing the number of people on the Board of Trustees from 9 members to 7 members. The Nominating Committee will be reduced from 6 members of the congregation to 3 members of the congregation. The committee will be chaired by a Session member currently serving and will include a representative of the Board of Trustees and a representative from the Congregational Care Committee.

The restructuring proposal also includes changes to the Session committees and in some cases, to the number of Elders chairing the committees. These were identified in the document distributed in November.

George Kilpatrick and Robin Hadfield co-chaired this Task Force, which included Susan Budler and Robby Shortridge, as representatives of the Board of Trustees, Darrell Nelson, as a representative of the Memorial and Endowment Committee, and Jo Bateman and Sarah Bevans, as representatives of the congregation.

The Task Force hopes that this proposal will help Eastridge respond to the changes in the past few years and allow Eastridge to continue serving God as a community of faith. A copy of the document including the proposed bylaw amendments, which was circulated in November, may be requested from the church office.

#### Dear Faith Family -


