


Fourth Friday Women's Coffee:

From the Green Team: In case you missed it! On January 4, 2024, the Journal Star ran an article with



the Headline: "City announces heat pump incentive program for Lincoln Homeowners". The incentive is \$1,000.00 toward the cost of an air-source heat pump. It is \$3,000.00 if you qualify as a low-income homeowner! The City has budgeted \$500,000.00 to be distributed on a first come first serve basis. Funds will be available until August 31, or until they are all expended. And on top of that, homeowners are eligible for an additional \$800.00 incentive through LES!

ASH WEDNESDAY Meal & Worship:


This year Lent begins on February 14 (Ash Wednesday).
