



From the Pastor's Pen...

The May 1956 edition of "News of the Month" for Eastridge Presbyterian Church had this front-page headline, "Congregational Meeting." The article read, "The Session has called a Congregational meeting for Sunday, May 6th following the Morning Service for the purpose of the election of a Board of Deacons." It

seemed appropriate at that time to ordain and install the newly elected board on Mother's Day, May 13, 1956, the same day the community celebrated three years of worshipping together.

After a summer of meetings to organize, the September 1956 edition of "News of the Month" summarized the activities of the new board. board grew to 37 members at its largest. In more recent years, that became 25 members. What began with committees of necessity for the formation of a new faith community became a geographical parishbased ministry. In more recent years, the board returned to a caring ministry of celebrating and caring for the community through good and difficult times. I have read the minutes that outline how the board

> would care for those who were celebrating the addition of a new child to their family - in those early years our congregation was made up of mostly young families moving into the new housing development by the Strauss Brothers. I have heard the personal account of deacons who were the first asked to provide a luncheon following a funeral; deacons who notoriously showed up for hospital and home visits; deacons delivering flowers,

ing responsibilities: ushering, hospital calling and sending flowers to those who are ill, sending cards to those who are ill and flowers to those families bereaved, keeping in contact with servicemen at home and abroad through letters and bulletins, and caring for after the service greeting and meeting of guests. The past 68 years has seen a lot of change in church and society, but one thing has remained constant: the Board of Deacons has cared for the community of Eastridge Presbyterian Church.

Of course, how that caring has been done has evolved over those 68 years. What began with a 12 member

sending cards, making coffee, providing rides.

This past January, at our Annual Congregational Meeting, the congregation passed changes to our bylaws that dissolved the Board of Deacons. I have been personally touched by the response I've heard from the most recent actively serving deacons. This change to our bylaws made sense, was needed, and in many ways brings forward new ways of caring for each other. One of my favorite reassurances was the deacon who said, "it won't stop us from caring for each other and that's what a deacon does!"

This coming Mother's Day, May 12, we will celebrate the past ministry of the Board of Deacons, as well as celebrate a new ministry called "Eastridge Care Connections." Our hope is to honor and celebrate the gifts of caring shared with the community over the past 68 years, as well as to acknowledge the new thing happening among us. If you have ever served in this congregation as an ordained deacon, we would like to recognize and celebrate you. If you feel called to serve with Eastridge Care Connections, we would love to celebrate you.

For me, there's a certain poetic beauty to designating Mother's Day at Eastridge Presbyterian Church as Caring Sunday. When that day was first chosen, I thought it was beautiful because of the celebration of the call of the church to care for each other as a mother hen cares for her chicks (this is a Biblical image of God's care for us repeated throughout scripture). What began on Mother's Day in 1956 with the ordination of 12 deacons will continue in a new way. We can't stop our deacons from caring for us. It's what they do. It's who they are.

The September 1956 article ended its summary of the deacons activities with this, "This ministering to the needs of the members and friends of Eastridge Church is vital and extremely important to the life of the Church. Let us each assist...in whatever way we can." The call to our faith community is the same today as it was then, as we care for each other in the name of our shared faith in the one who heals, restores, and celebrates.

Please join us in giving thanks and praise to God for the caring ministry of Eastridge Presbyterian Church!

Our very own adaptation of this endeavor of hand copying all 1,189 chapters of the Christian Scriptures was completed by the hands of 483 individuals from all across Nebraska or with some kind of connection to the Cornhusker state. They are believers of all stripes, as well as folks who don't call a particular faith

their own. At the time, some were as young as 9 years old, some in their nineties. Some are saints who have since passed on.


Recently, I read this challenge by theologian and author Miroslav Volf:

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE RECOGNITION


