



Celebrating 10 years of

EASTRIDGE Presbyterian Church



In the summer and fall months of 2014, the GROW Committee explored embracing a new logo, tagline, and website design. The idea was planted following a day of VBS, when some of the young volunteers offered their ideas in the hallway outside the pastor's offices. As part of their exploration, the GROW Committee asked the session to consider if maybe a new mission statement was needed. After re-affirming the mission statement adopted in 1993, the session agreed that a short tag-line, a new logo, and new website design would be welcome.

After meeting with a local marketing firm, the following guidelines were given:

The logo font was to be easy to read, simple, and eye-catching.

The colors of the logo would be reflective but not identical to the colors of the PC(USA) cross.

The idea of an Eastridge Presbyterian Church "e" that was first brought forward by a young person would be preferred, if it could incorporate a cross.

As the idea was refined and our current logo started to emerge, one of the distinctive features is the inward movement that symbolizes the community gathering around the cross. We are the body of Christ, supporting each other as a faith community. At the same time the movement leads inward, there is also an outward movement. This speaks to the body of Christ going out into the world.

The tagline, "Christ-Centered. Community Strong." also clarifies our identity as the gathered body of Christ in the world.

As we celebrate the 10th Anniversary of our distinctive logo, we reflect the many ways it has become an identifying feature for our faith community. In every print and online, on car clings and stickers, hats, mugs, drinking glasses, mobile battery chargers, notebooks, blankets, t-shirts, sweatshirts, and hats.

This July, the session would like to make t-shirts, sweatshirts, and hats available to the faith community for purchase through Relentless Merch, a local small business. There's a bit of a twist this time, with the addition of Micah 6:8 to the back of the shirt, "Do Justice. Love Mercy. Walk Humbly." We are hopeful that these will be worn when we're actively visible in the community - at the Eastridge Food Pantry, the Leffler Food Market, The Gathering Place, Justice in Action events, and other shared community ministries.

T-shirts will be available in black, gray, and white; sweatshirts in gray. More information to come on a link to purchase these items! If cost is prohibitive, please reach out, as funds are available so that all can order.

with Group Mission Trip

This year the Middle and High School youth joined the youth from First Presbyterian Church for a joint mission trip. June 19 -23 we spent time in Kansas City serving the community as well as having fellowship together. Our first workday was spent with Hillcrest Transitional Housing. This is an organiza-

tion that works to assist those who need housing and all the furnishing for a home. They provide temporary housing and, while they are there, work with them on budgeting and living skills. Within 90 days, they are able to help folks transition into permanent housing situations. Our work with them was in their thrift store. The store is open to the community and all the proceeds from the thrift store help to

support the entire organization. We learned many things while in partnership with Hillcrest. First, the organization works very hard at recycling all that comes to them. Very little ends up in the landfill. In their efforts to recycle, they have wonderful partnerships with other organizations throughout Kansas City. Sec-



ond, don't assume that because someone has a need, they will take anything regardless of the condition.

Our second day was spent at Harvesters Community Food Bank. This was much like the Food Bank of Lincoln. While at Harvesters, we filled boxes that will be used for their senior clients. We worked through thousands of pounds of food to fill around 400 boxes. To finish our time there, we filled crates with 30lbs of fresh vegetables. These vegetables would be sent out to local food pantries for distribution. While this work wasn't new to us, it helped us see what needs to happen before the Food Bank of Lincoln sends items to the pantry at EPC.





Our third day was spent at Flourish: A Furniture Bank. This is an organization in the Kansas City area that provides all the items needed to furnish a home. During a week's time, the organization will have 40 families come through to choose couches, beds, kitchen tables and chairs, dressers, etc. In addition to large furniture items, the guests choose

bedding, dishes, kitchen items, and décor. All of this is provided to help set up families to succeed.

We had a fabulous week! It was good to work together with a partner church and organizations in the Kansas City area. We appreciate all the support from Eastridge! THANK YOU!


