Personal loss after a death(s) of those who care for leaves many of us with a different identity---" I am a survivor" whether the loss is a traumatic sudden loss, a suicide loss, or a loss of child or adult following a series of medical hardships, leaving survivors searching to help themselves and loved ones to put their shattered lives together. This 90-minute conversation is the beginning of a pro-

cess of sharing tips, wisdom, and techniques to help one another in these times of crisis, the skills to survive and thrive are similar, yet different.



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS: SEPTEMBER 8, 2024

The Session approved the minutes of the Session meeting of August 18, 2024, and the special Session meeting of August 25, 2024.

The Session acknowledged that communion was served at the 9:30 a.m. service on September 1, 2024.

The Session removed Linda Carlson from the member rolls, deceased August 21, 2024, and acknowledged that

the Rev. Dr. Melodie Jones Pointon officiated at her funeral service on September 7, 2024, at Eastridge Presbyterian Church.

The Session carried a motion to receive Walter and Lillie Baggett into membership by letter of transfer.

The Session approved a motion to authorize that those persons commissioned to the EPC Care Connections Ministry may serve communion in homes, hospitals, and community worship services.

The Session approved a motion to allow a Trunk or Treat event sponsored by the Girl Scouts in the Eastridge parking lot on October 11, 2024.

Rev. Dr. Jones Pointon led the Session in a study of the topics planned for the Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany season, and for January and February 2025. The resource for Advent, Christmas and Epiphany will be "From the Manger," from Illustrated Ministries. The resource for January and February will be "Proclaiming the Parables"

by Thomas Long. Renae Oestmann and Carolyn Brandle volunteered to serve as conveners.

New chairs have been purchased for Fellowship Hall with contributions from Eastridge Presbyterian Wom-

en and the Memorial and Endowment Committee. New patio tables and benches for the meditation garden have been donated in memory of Dee Ann Dilley.

#### Aging Partners (chair yoga, tai chi classes at Eastridge)

Aging Partners plans, coordinates and advocates for older people in an eight-county area. Our mission is to enhance daily living, expand personal choices and educate the community to ensure the independence and full life of the people we serve.

Aging Partners was one of the country's first full-service Area Agencies on Aging. Our agency primarily serves individuals aged 60 and over. We offer a plethora of services to older adults. Some of these services include:



- Senior centers, which provide nutritious meals as well as games and entertainment
- A fitness center with a variety of state-of-the-art equipment specifically designed for older adults
- Fitness classes offered throughout the community
- Care management services, in which social workers can work with individuals in their home to address specific individual and family needs
- Advice on Medicare and other benefits
- Foot clinics staffed with nurses trained in foot care
- Legal services, home repair services, volunteer programs, Lifeline distribution, tax assistance, and many other services.


