





SABBATICAL NEWS: As part of Eastridge's commitment to pastoral renewal, pastors are eligible for a six-week sabbatical period after five years of service. Pastor Thomas will be on sabbatical beginning Thursday, May 15 and returning on Thursday, June 26.

At the center of Thomas' sabbatical is a spiritual pilgrimage along the Camino de Santiago, an ancient path in northern Spain that has drawn pilgrims for centuries. Designed especially for clergy, this pil-

grimage offers space to unplug, reflect, and encounter the Sacred—one step at a time. The journey is organized through Columbia Theological Seminary's Preachers Studio for Renewal. It includes daily hikes anywhere between 10-15.5 miles, lots of stretching (yes, yoga!), group reflection, and some great Spanish food! In addition to the Camino, Pastor Thomas will use this time for rest, family connection, and the spiritual practice of "being where his feet are." Please keep him and his family in your prayers during this time!

The **Pentecost Offering** unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. Psalm 71 testifies that a foundation of faith established during childhood helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life. 
