



What is a Land Acknowledgment?

We can trace the beginnings of Land Acknowledg-

ment from Australia through Canada to the United States. Its original intention was to "give honor to the Aboriginal peoples and as a way to increase the rights of these Indigenous peoples." It is most often a statement recognizing that a building or event is on land originally inhabited by Native Americans.



The 223rd General Assembly (held in 2018), urged many church bodies to consider this as a step in dismantling racism and addressing the denomination's

historic harms against Indigenous people. Following her sabbatical last year where she researched her genealogy and her family's journey west along to

> Mormon Trail, Rev. Dr. Melodie Jones Pointon (Senior Pastor and Moderator of the Session) asked the Session to consider establishing a committee to explore the desire for a Land Acknowledgment at EPC.


